Examination Preparation:

Abdomen/ Kidneys:

Do not eat, drink, or consume anything by mouth 8 hours prior to examination.
No smoking or chewing gum 4 hours prior to examination.

Pelvis/ Obstetric

Full bladder is required. Please drink four – 8 ounce glasses (1 litre) of water, finished one hour prior to appointment time. Do not empty bladder until after the examination. If your bladder is not full, the examination may have to be rescheduled.
You may eat your regular meals and/or a snack prior to the exam.

Abdomen and Pelvis

Full bladder is required. Please drink four – 8 ounce glasses (1 litre) of water, finished one hour prior to appointment time. Do not empty bladder until after the examination. If your bladder is not full, the examination may have to be rescheduled.
Do not eat, drink, or consume anything else by mouth (other than water) for 8 hours prior to examination: no other liquids, chewing gum, lozenges or food 8 hours before exam.
No smoking 4 hours prior to exam.

Kidneys, Ureters, Bladders

Full bladder is required. Please drink four – 8 ounce glasses (1 litre) of water, finished one hour prior to appointment time. Do not empty bladder until after the examination. If your bladder is not full, the examination may have to be rescheduled.
You may eat your regular meals and/or a snack prior to the exam.

Thyroid/Scrotum/Vascular

No Preparation is required.

Clothing

An ultrasound may require you to remove articles of clothing and you may be asked to put on a paper gown. Some jewelry articles may interfere with the test and may have to be removed. Loose clothing is required for most ultrasound exams.

During The Test

The sonographer will place a lubricating gel onto the area being examined to ensure a device called a transducer makes contact with your skin. For some ultrasound tests (transvaginal and transrectal), the probe is inserted into a natural opening in the body. Most other ultrasound tests are done on the skin surface.

After The Test

You can remove the ultrasound gel with relative ease and no traces. You may go about your daily activities immediately after the test unless otherwise advised by our staff. The reports will be produced by the reading physician and shared with your referring doctor. You may discuss these results with your doctor at a follow-up appointment.
